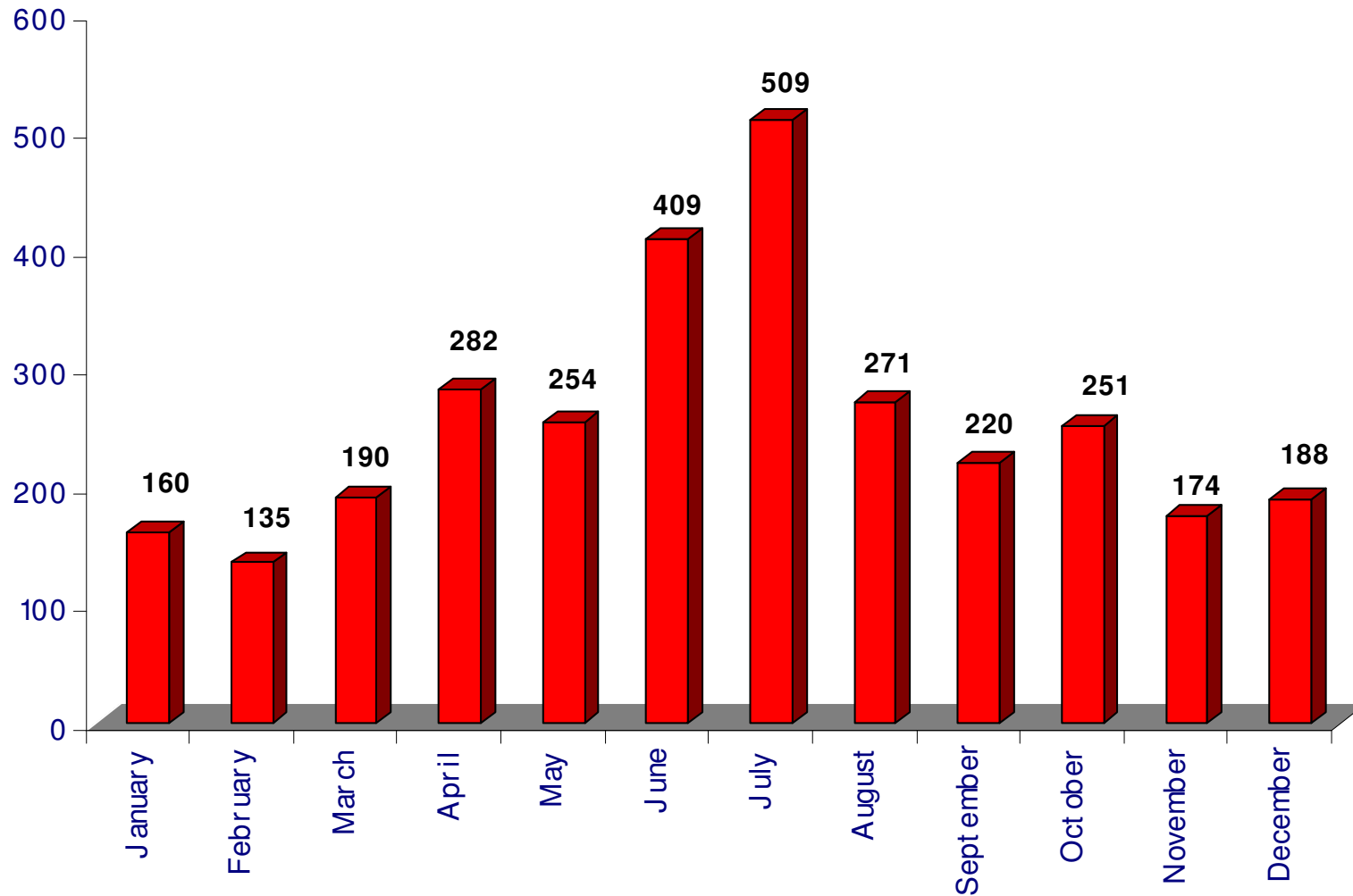

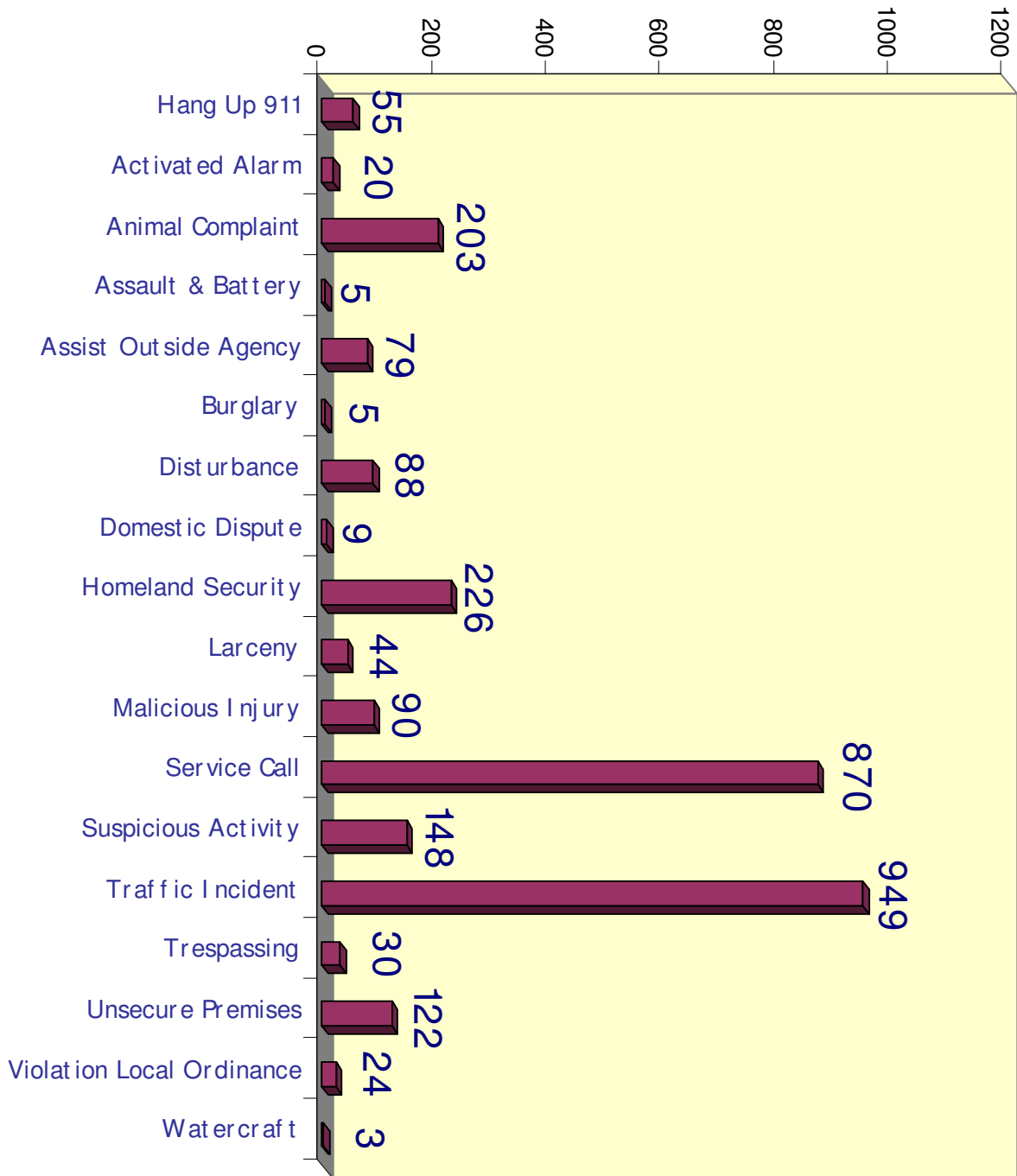

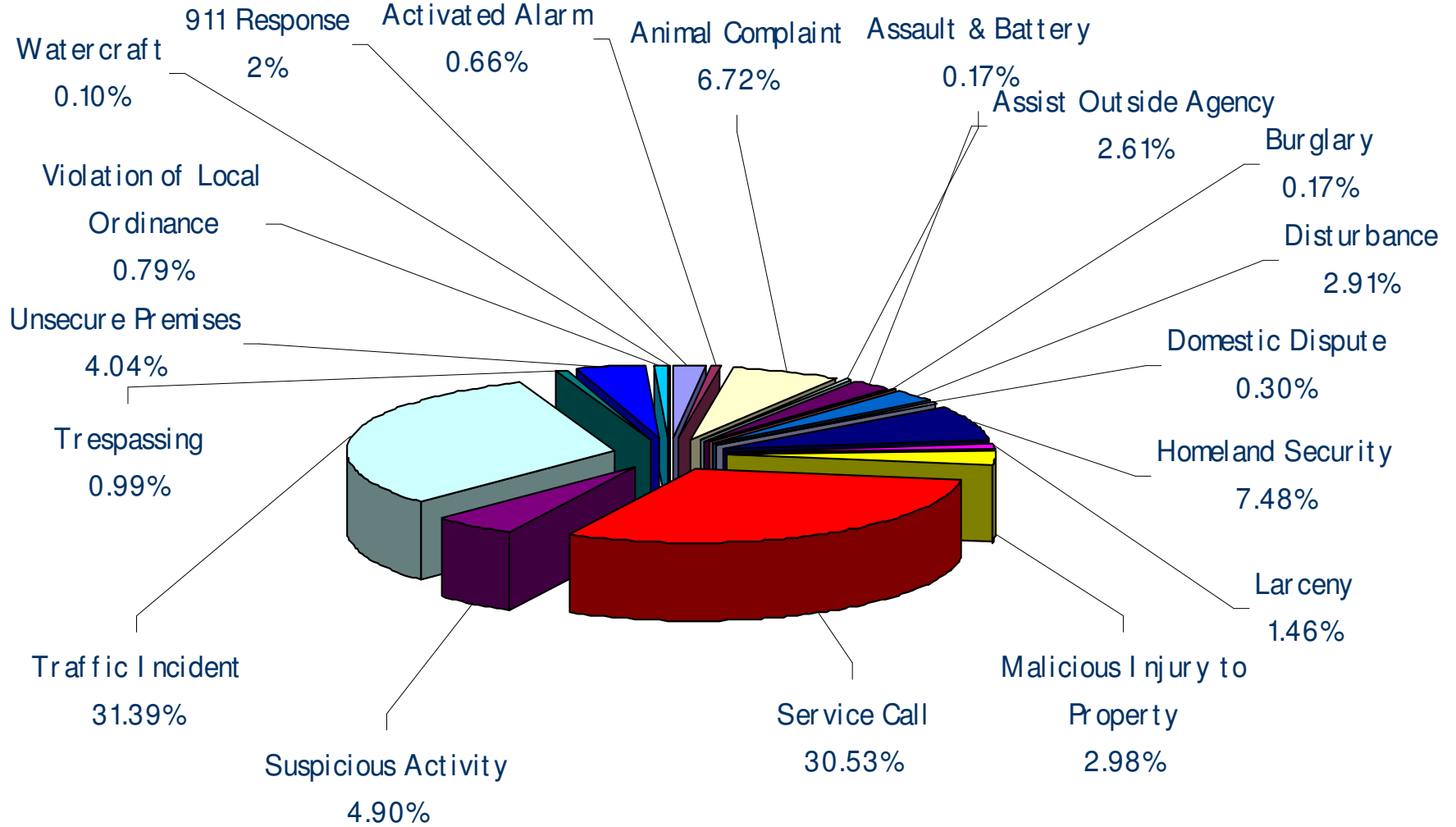
2004 Monthly Stat Totals



Breakdown of Incidents by Incident Type 2004

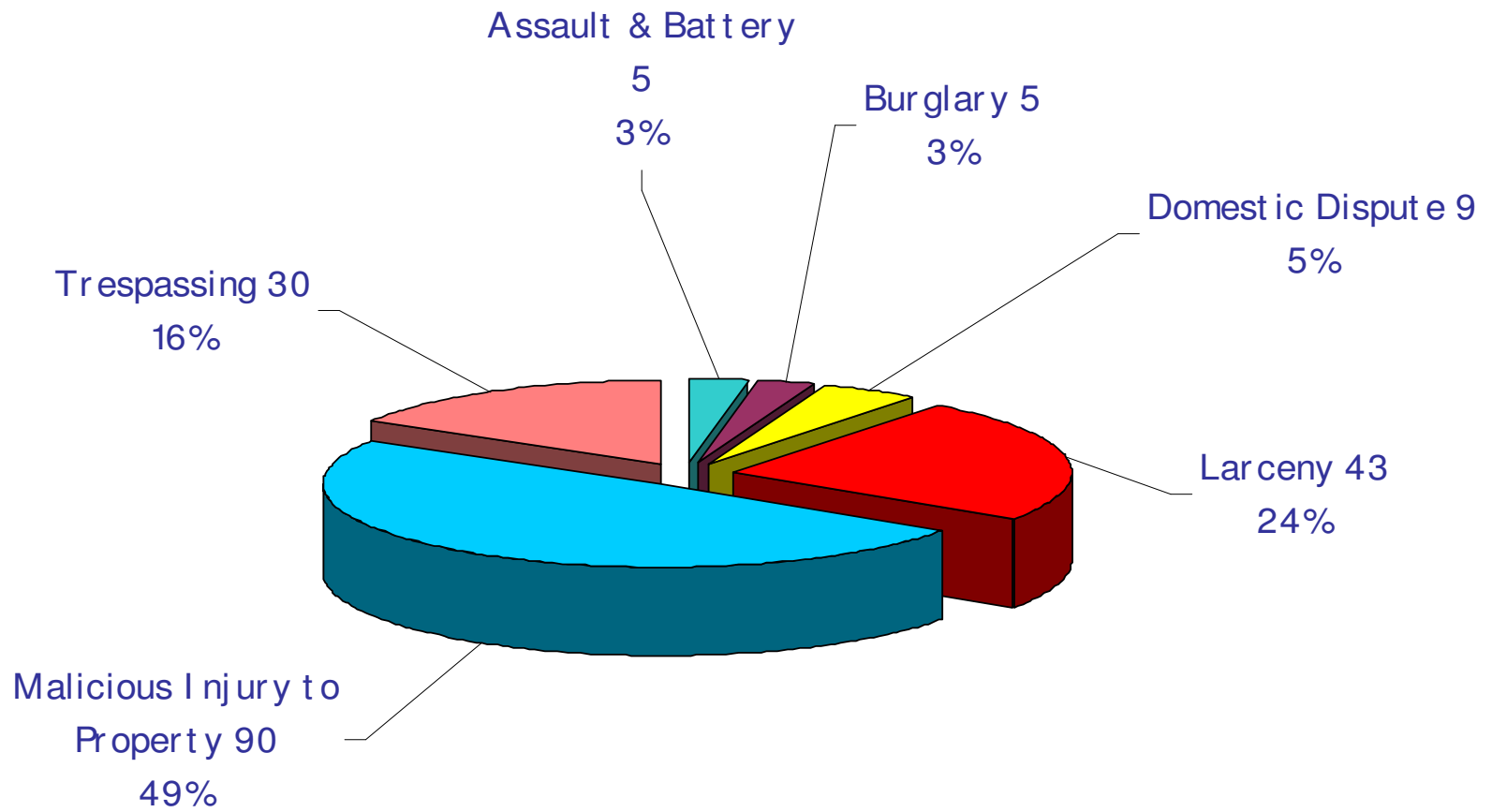

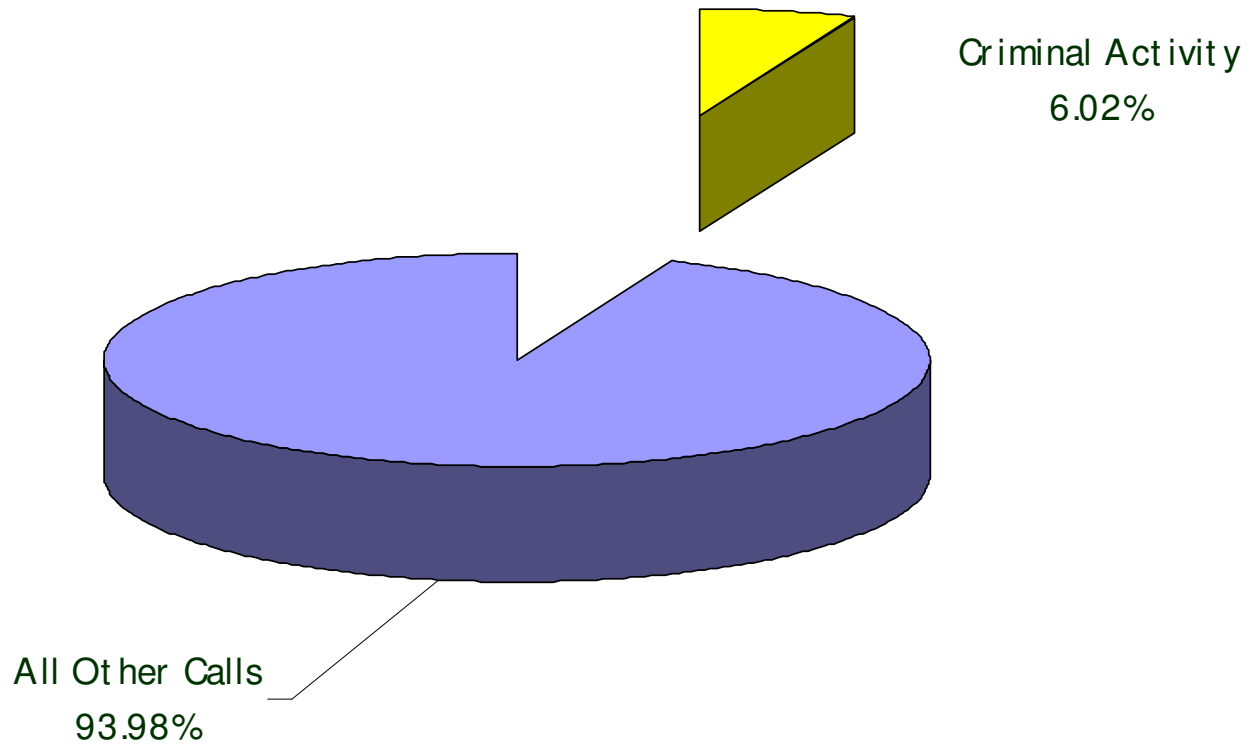

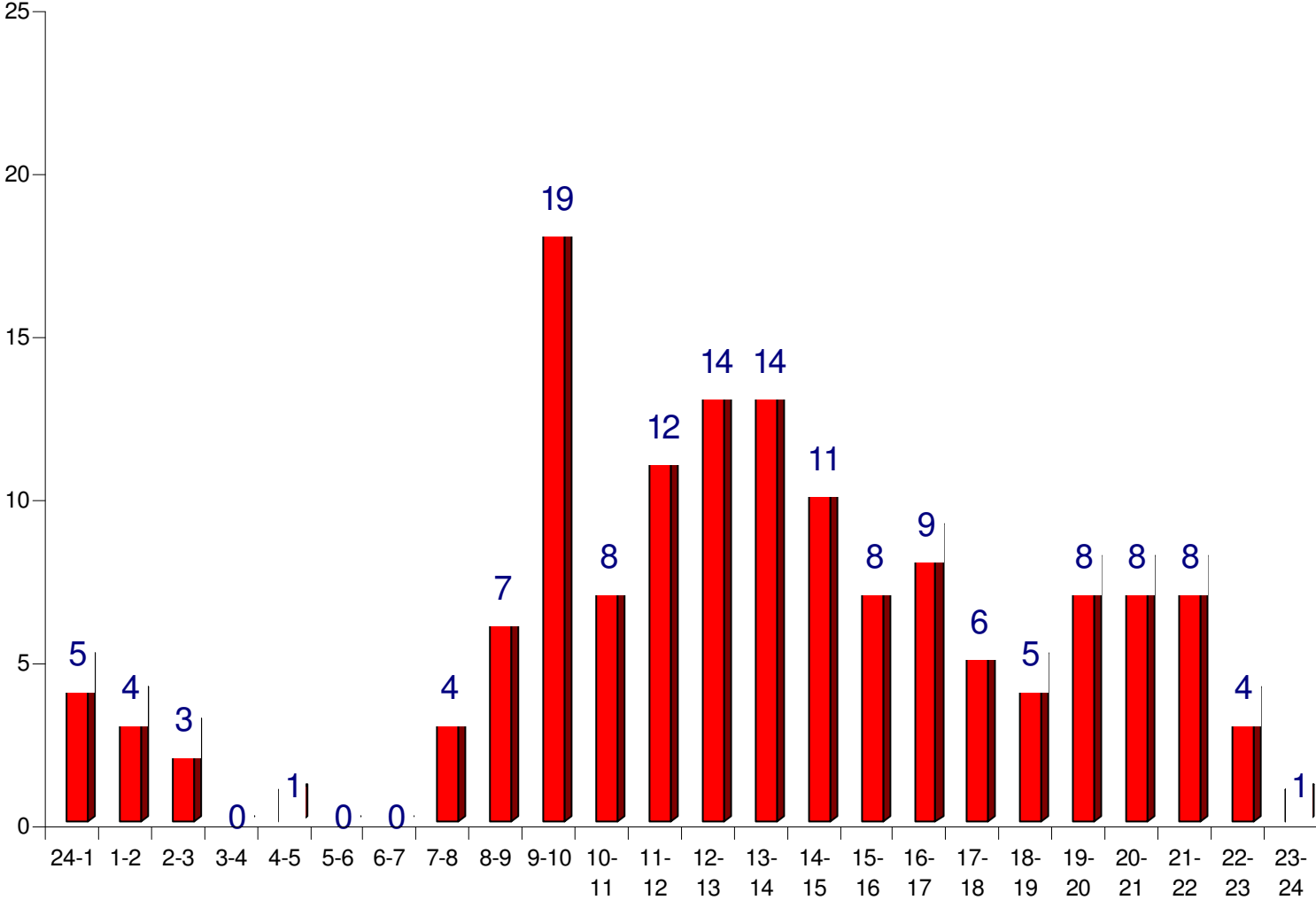
Criminal Calls 2004



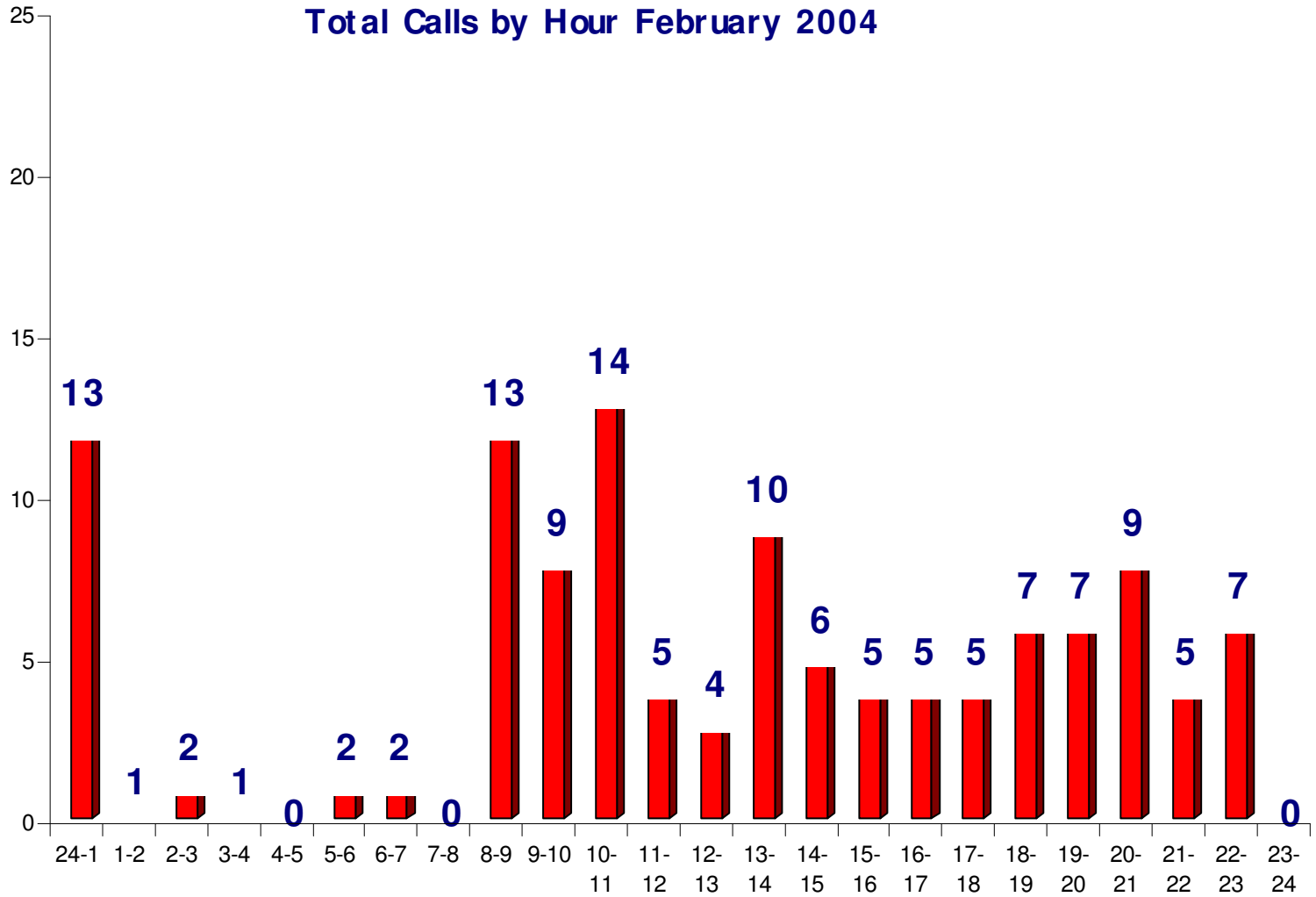
Criminal Activity Compared to all Other Calls



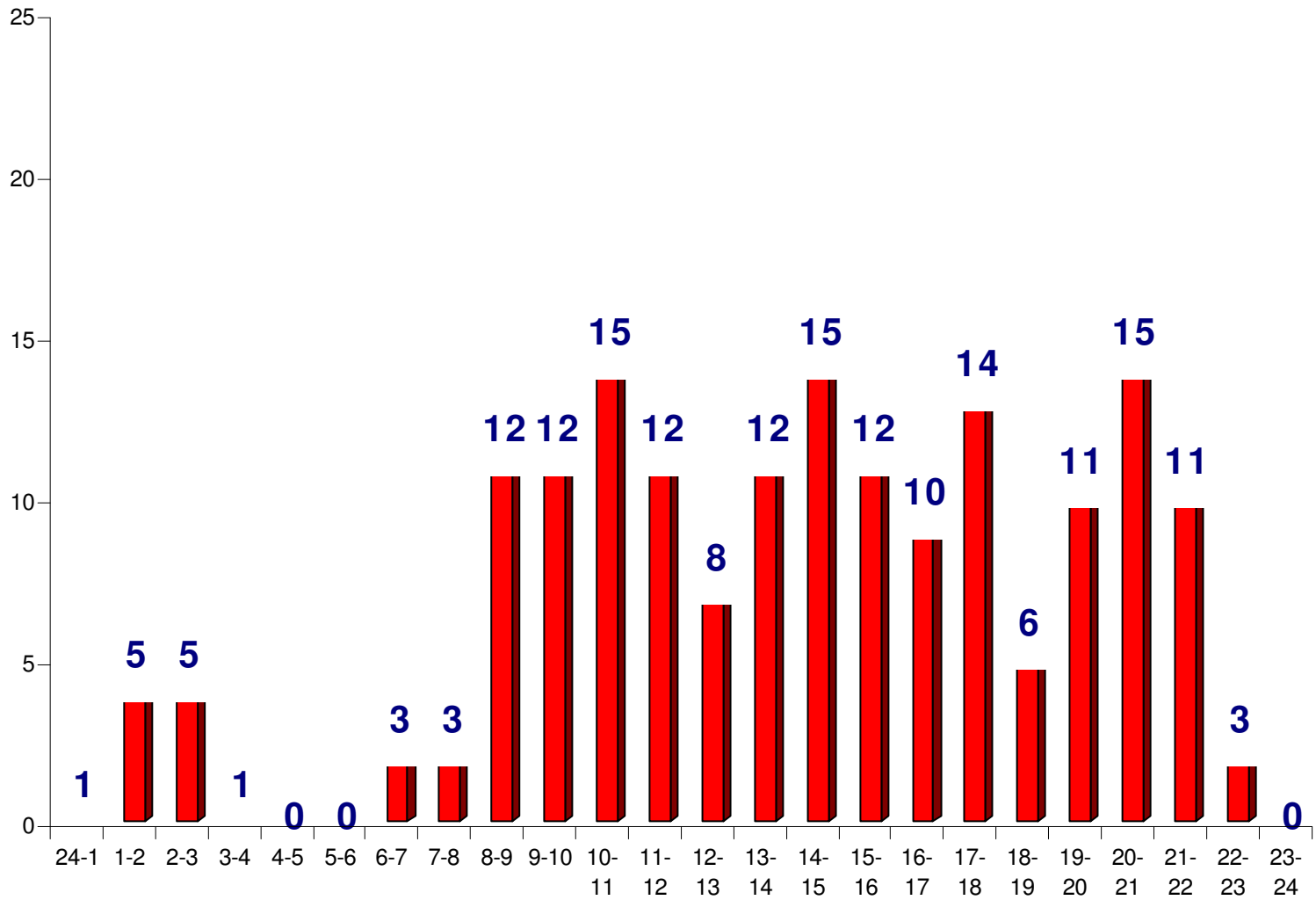
Total Calls by Hour January 2004



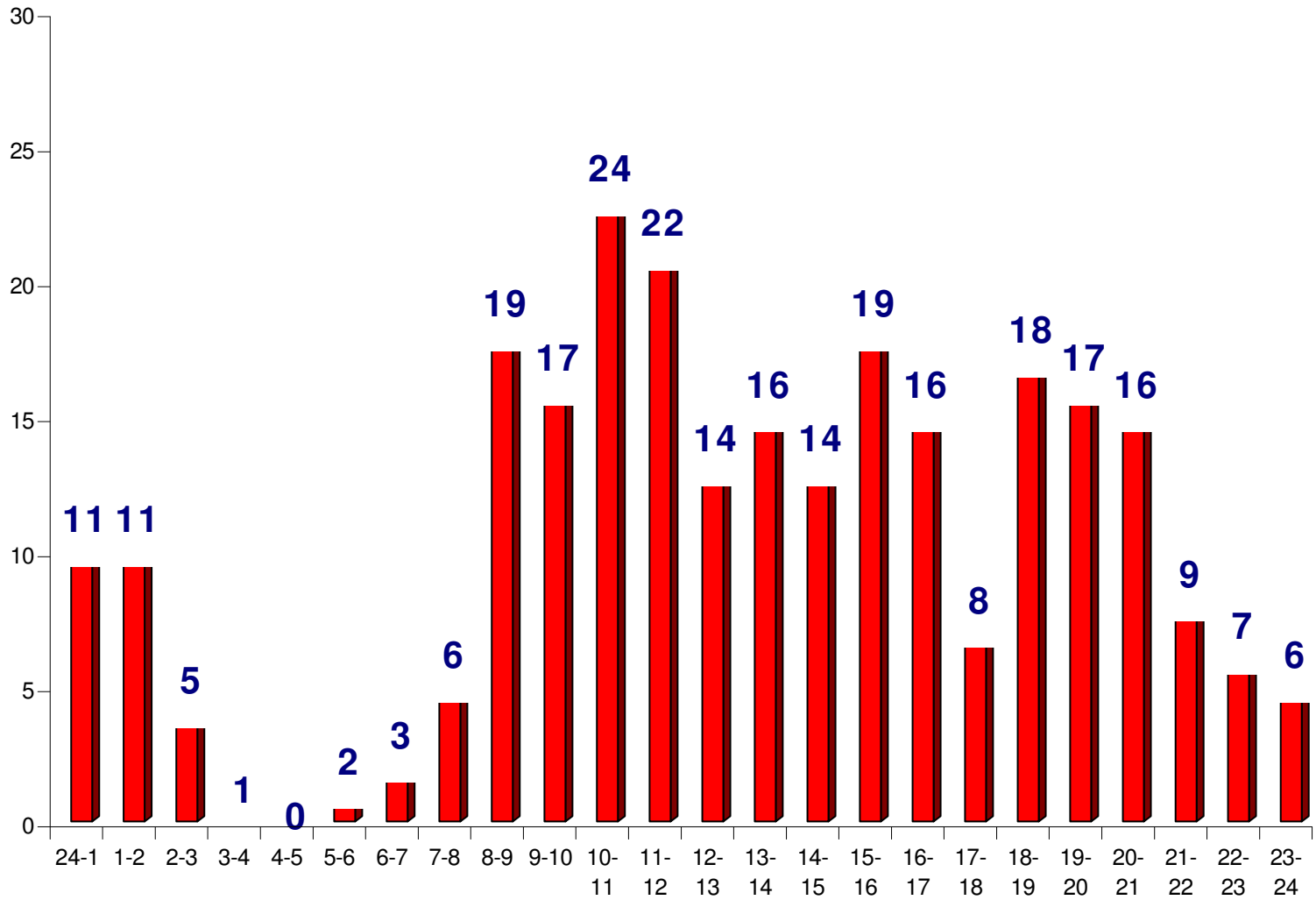
Total Calls by Hour February 2004



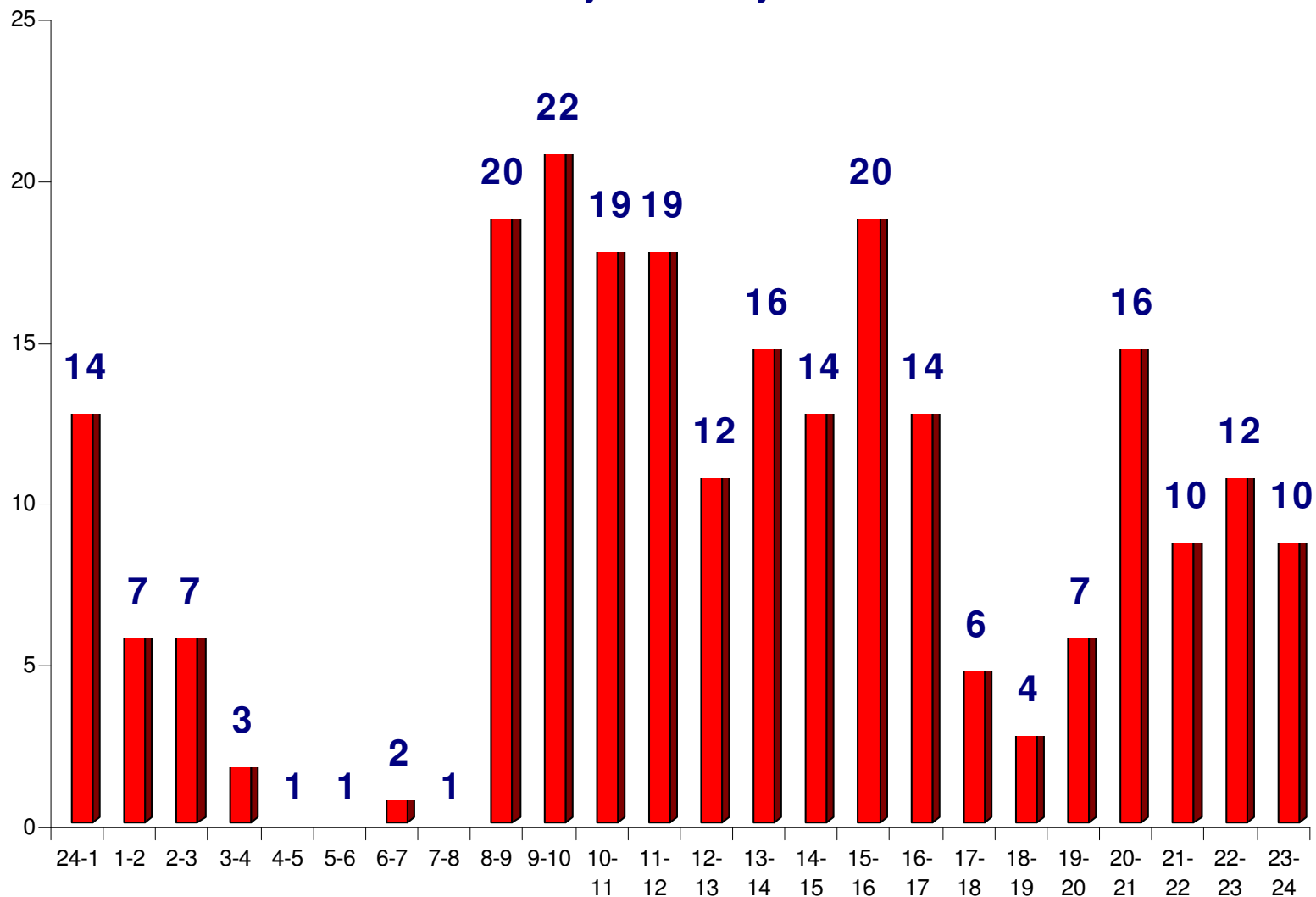
Total Calls by Hour March 2004



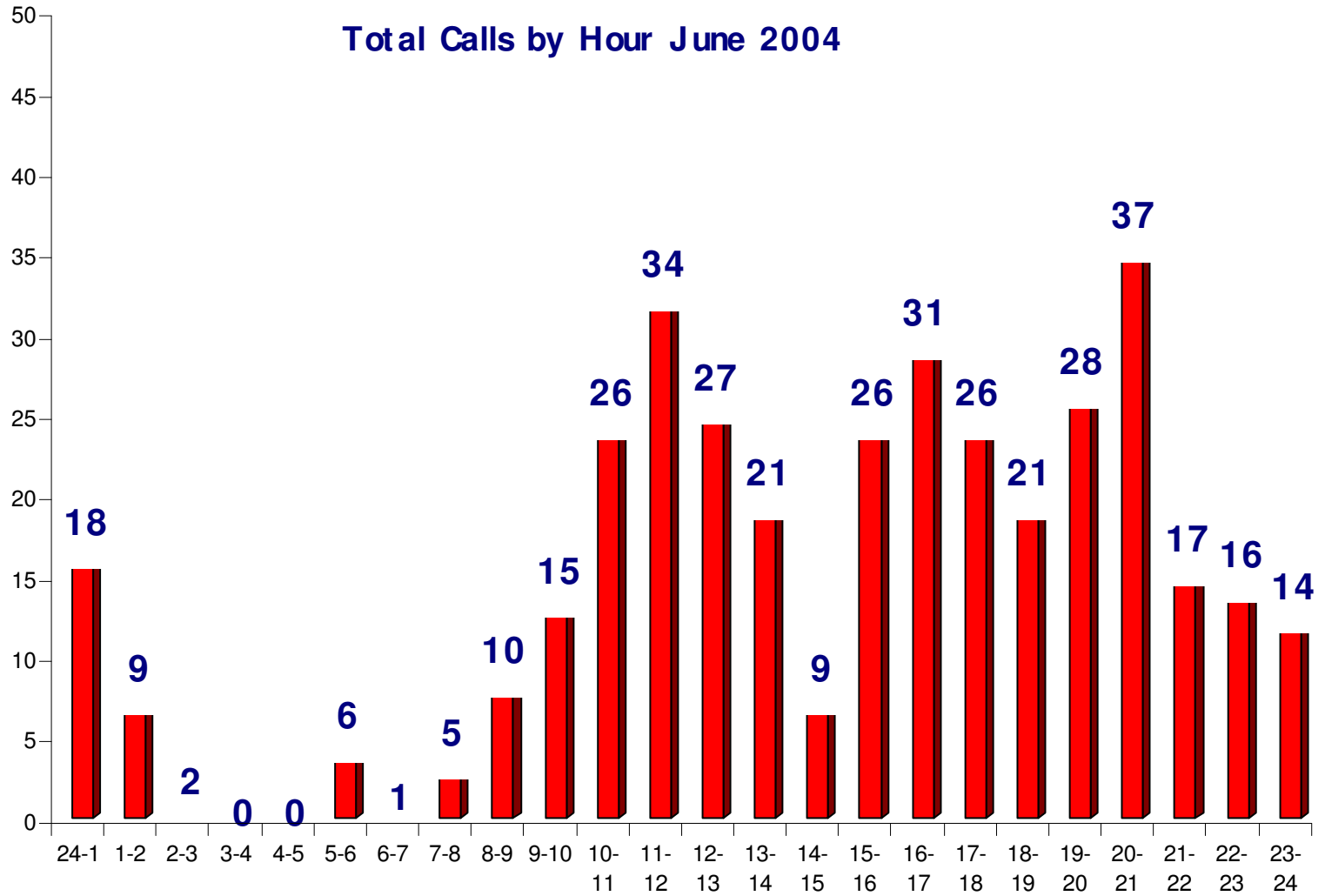
Total Calls by Hour April 2004



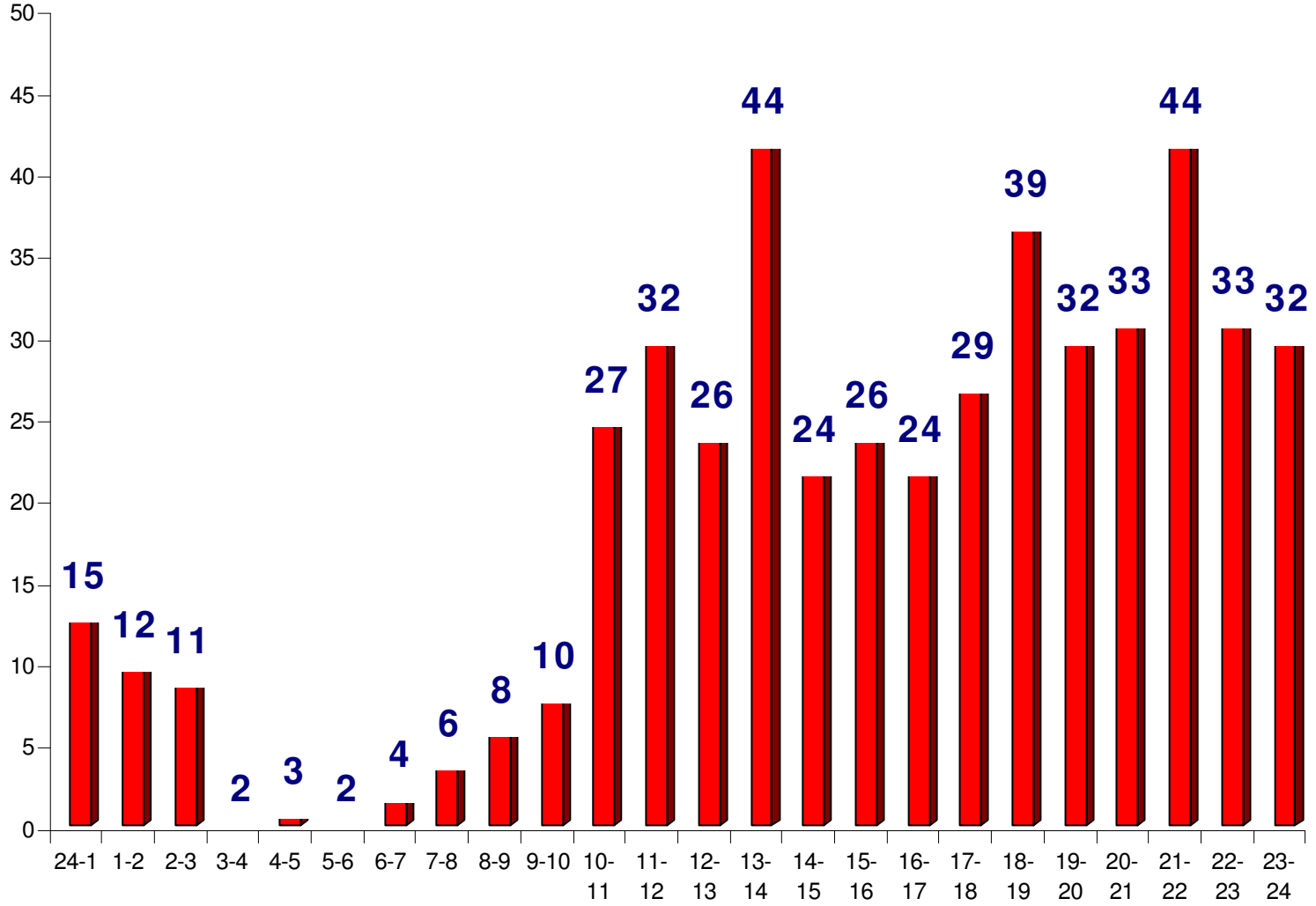
Total Calls by Hour May 2004



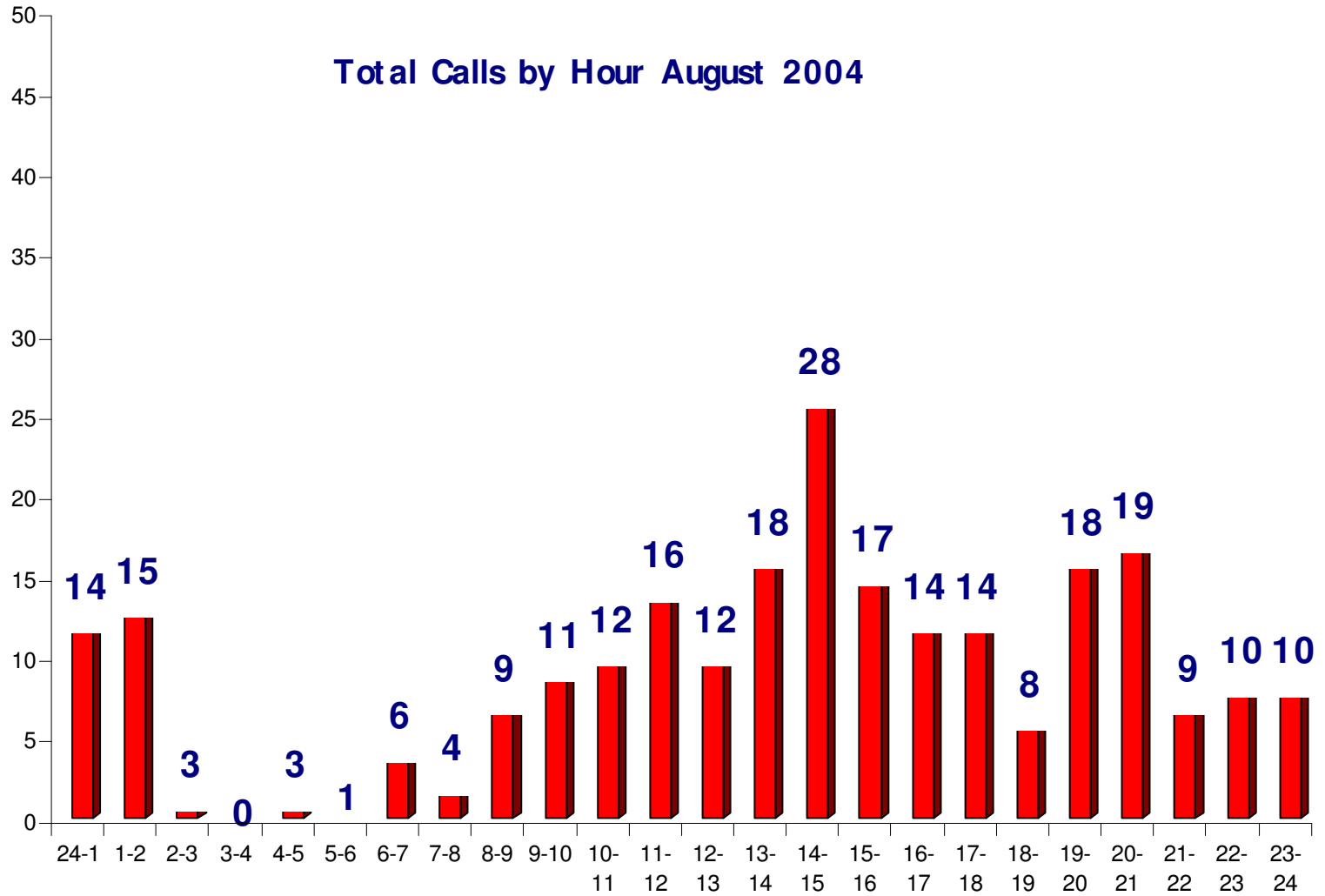
Total Calls by Hour June 2004



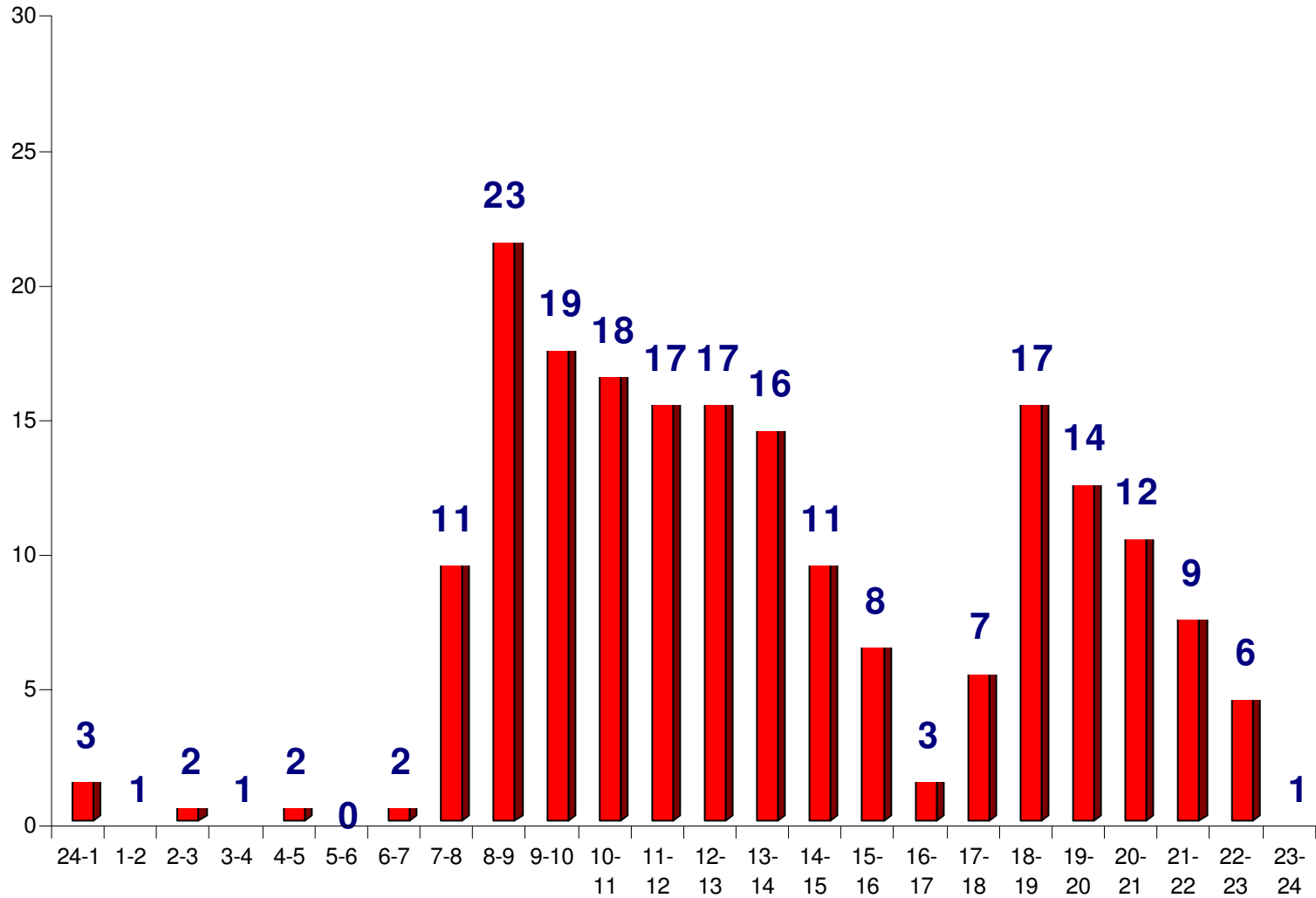
Total Calls by Hour July 2004



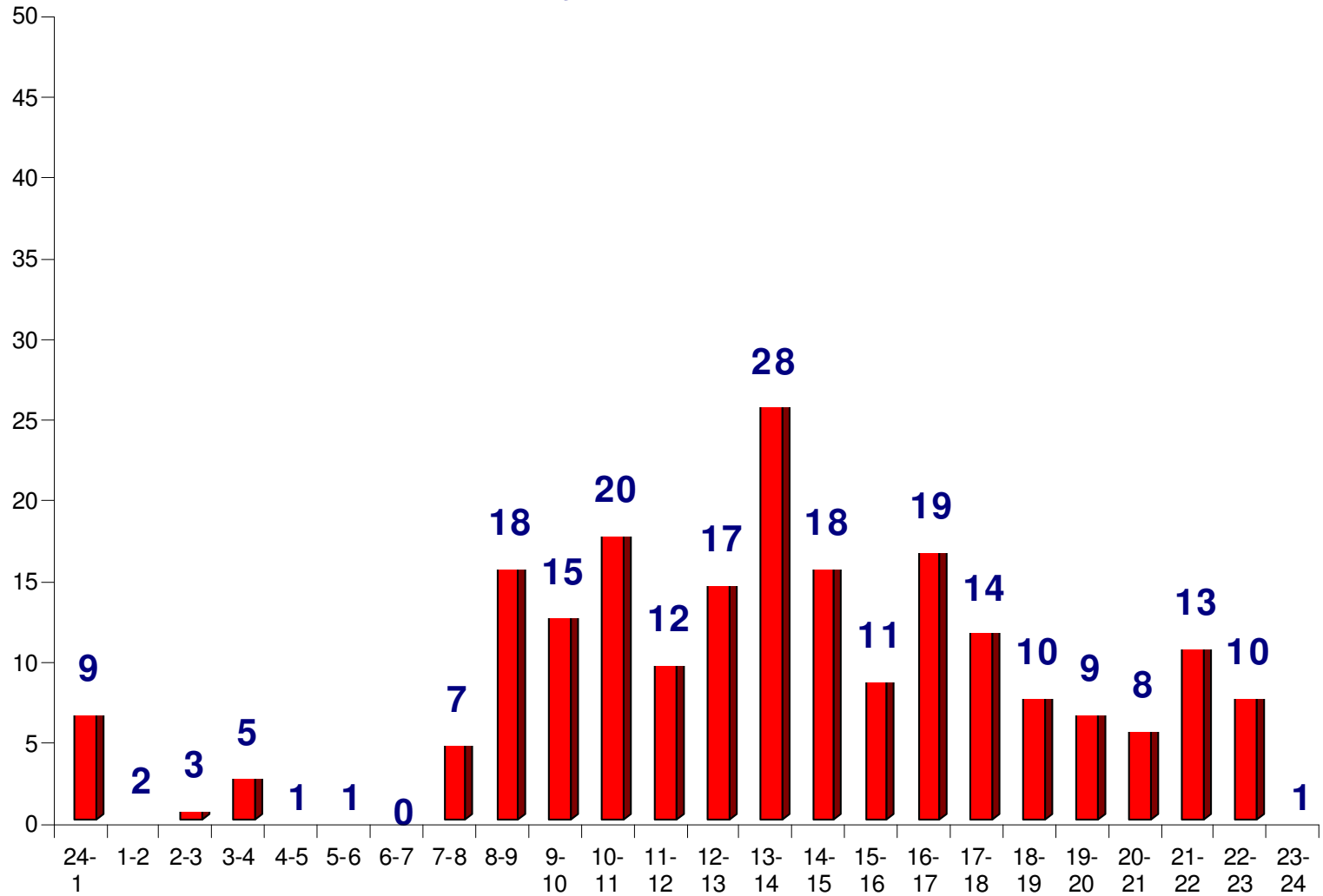
Total Calls by Hour August 2004



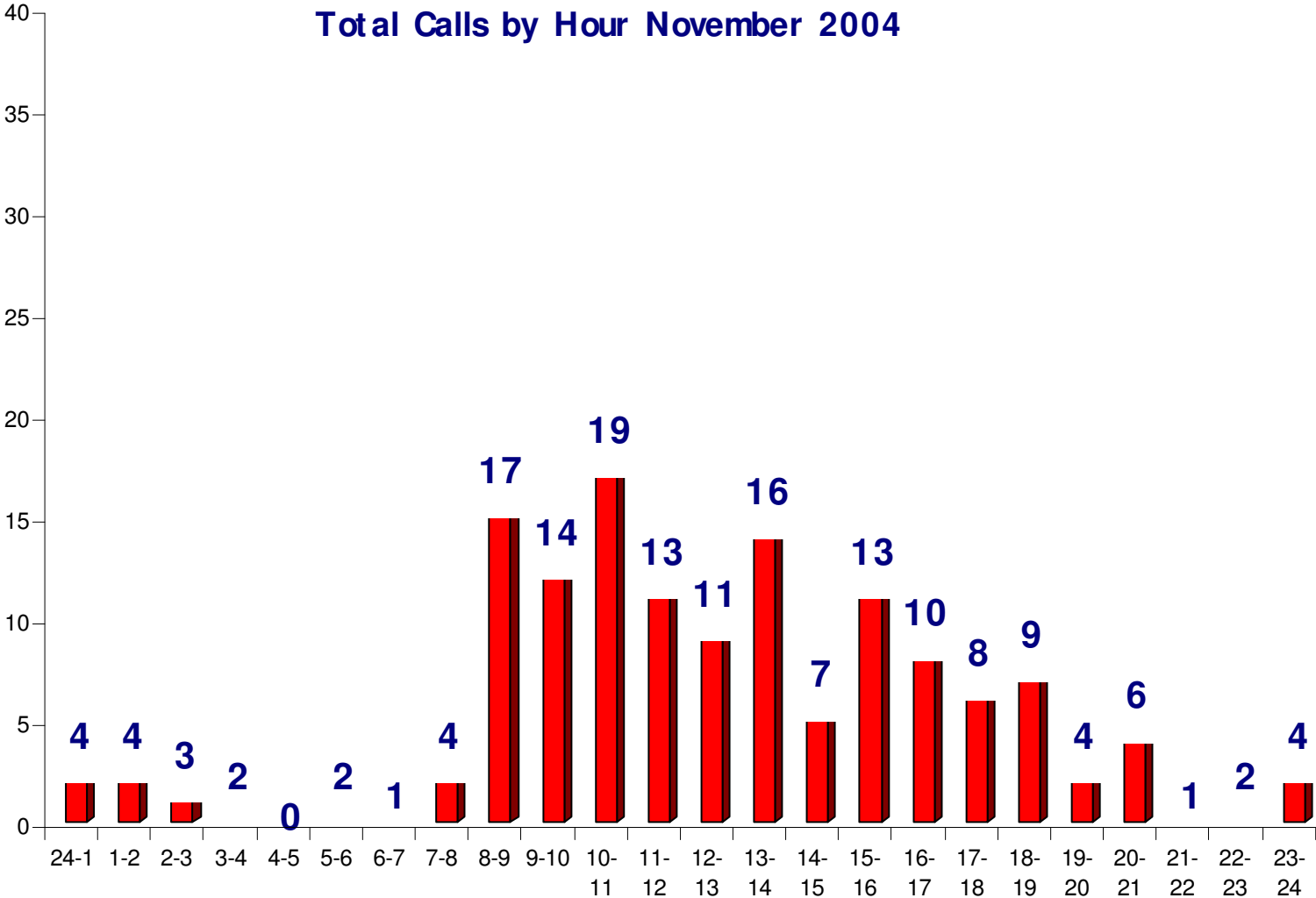
Total Calls by Hour September 2004



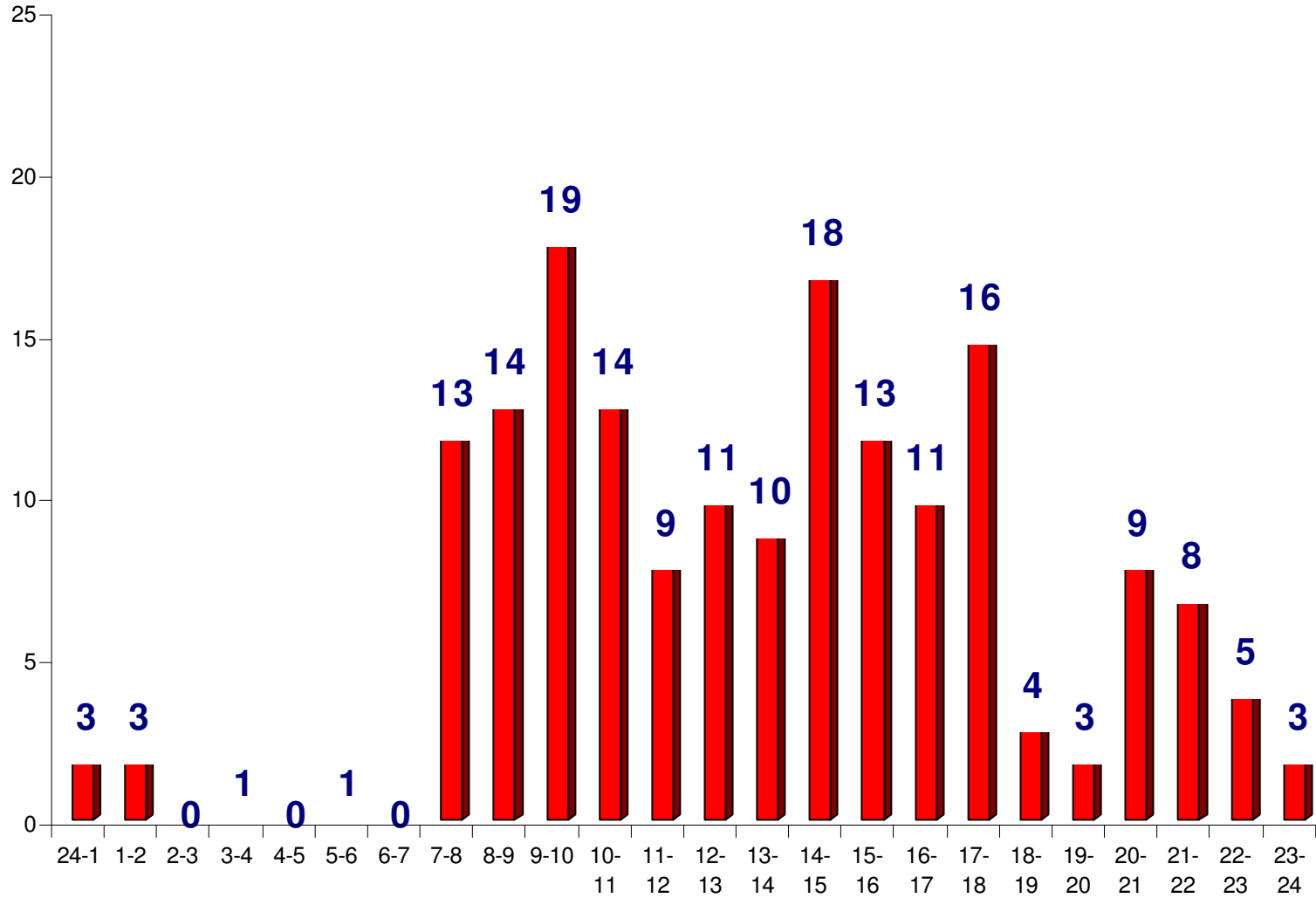
Total Calls by Hour October 2004



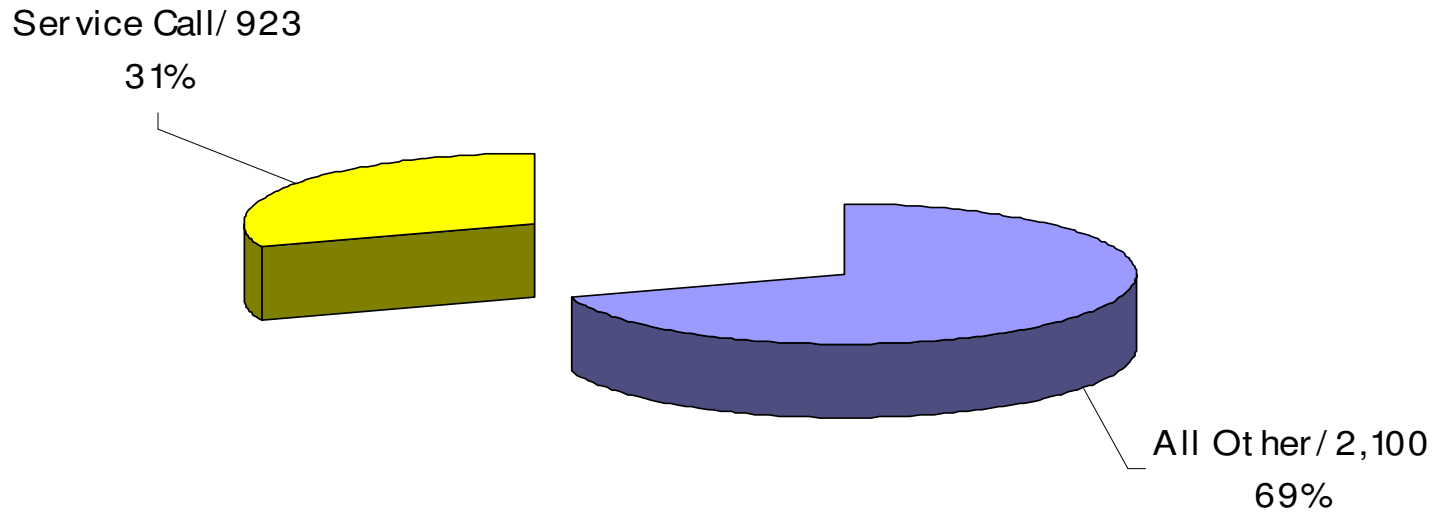
Total Calls by Hour November 2004

Service Calls

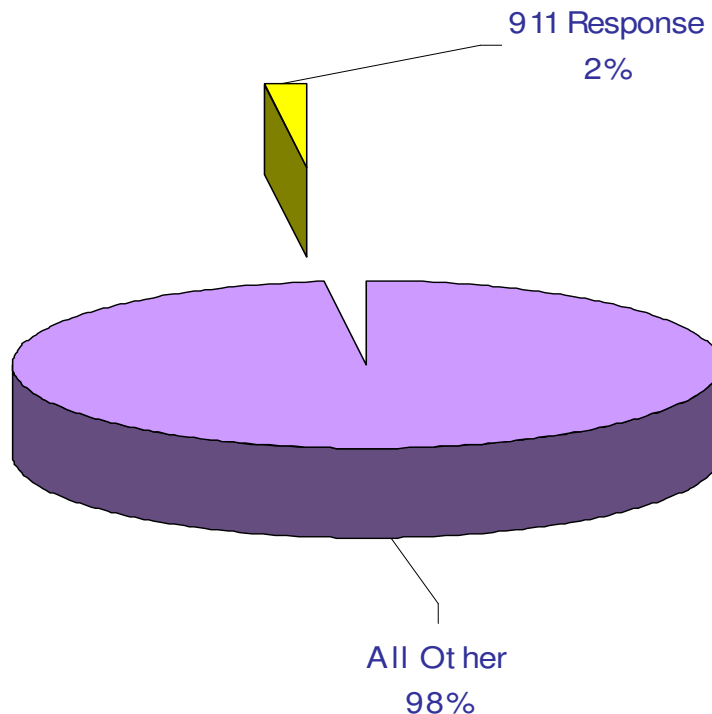

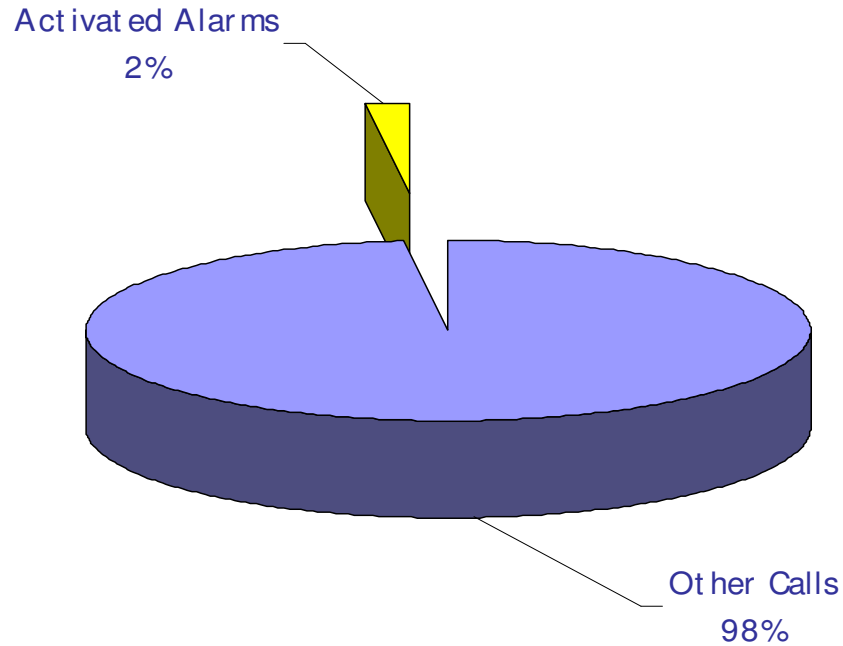
911 Responses



911 Response: With Beaufort County's advanced 911 system, they are able to track a 911 caller's location. Each call is responded to by a security patrol officer to ensure that everything is secure and no medical, law enforcement or fire department assistance is needed. Some calls do require back up assistance or follow up. Improvement in the phone lines have decreased the number of calls by 45%.

Activated Alarm

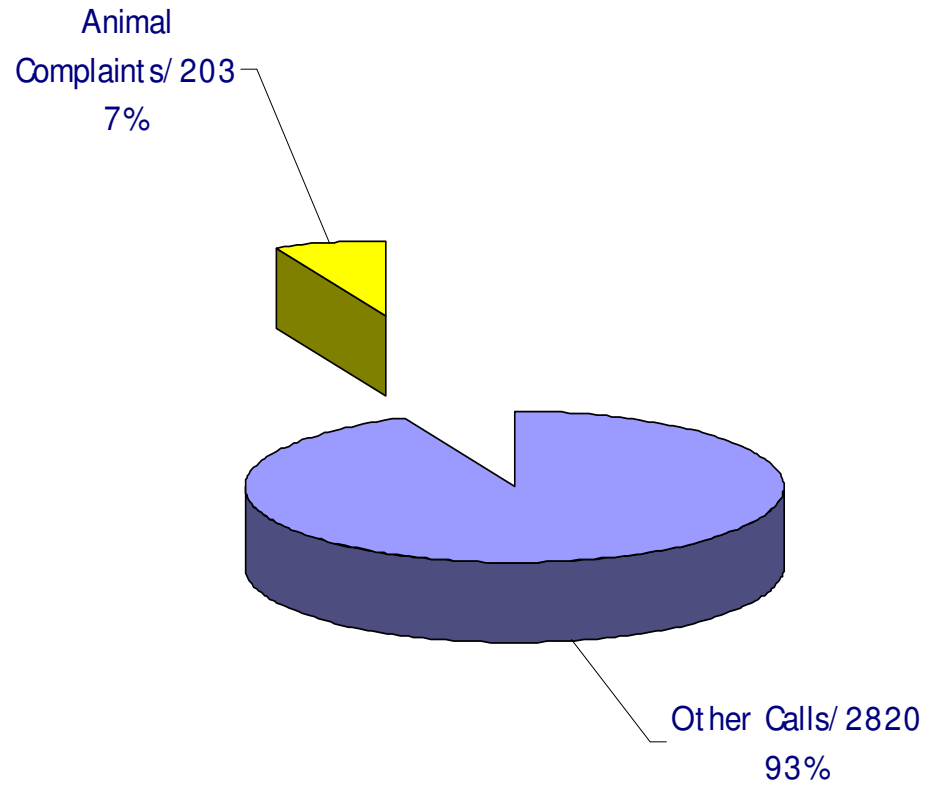


Activated Alarm: We may receive a call from an alarm company, County Dispatch or a neighbor that can hear an alarm. It is the duty of Fripp Island Security to ensure that there are no break-ins, fire or medical emergency in progress when they respond to an activated alarm call and that the residence is secured.

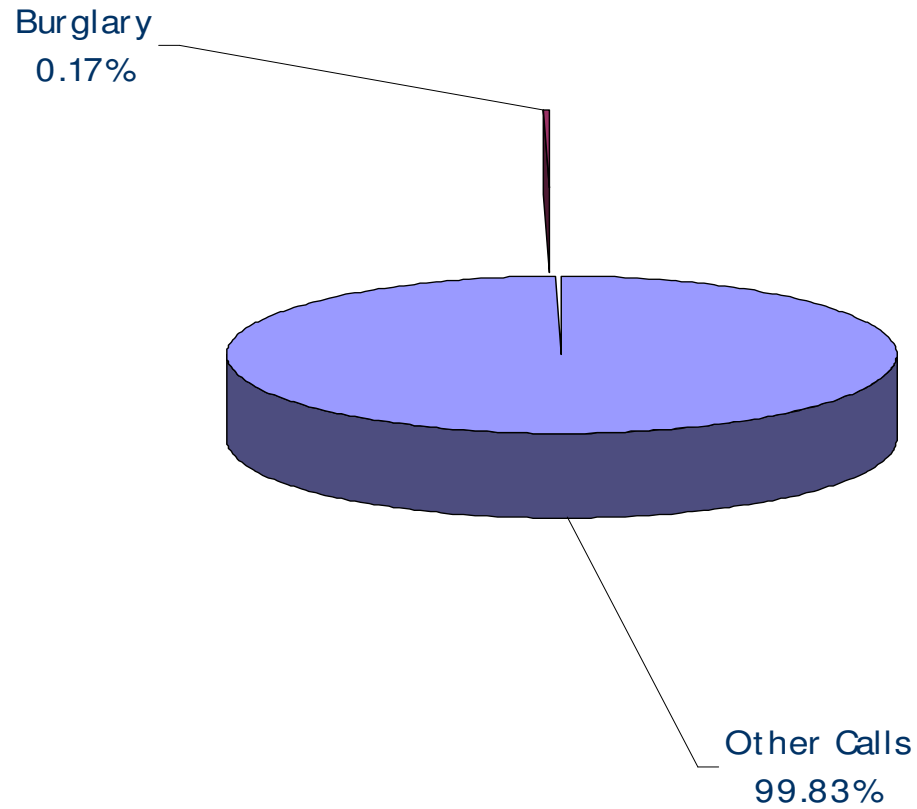
Animal Complaints 2004

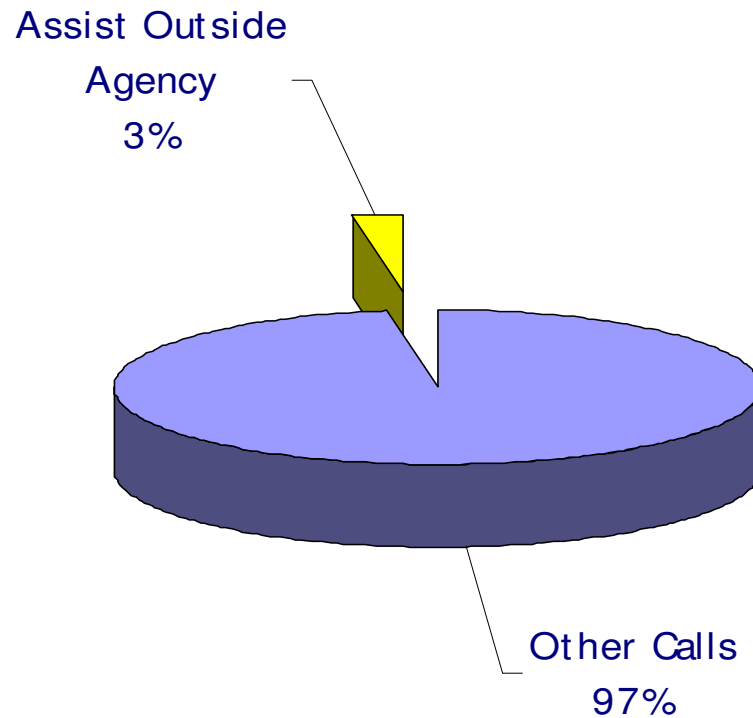


Burglary: Unfortunately, like other communities, Fripp has burglaries. However, the numbers have decreased significantly.

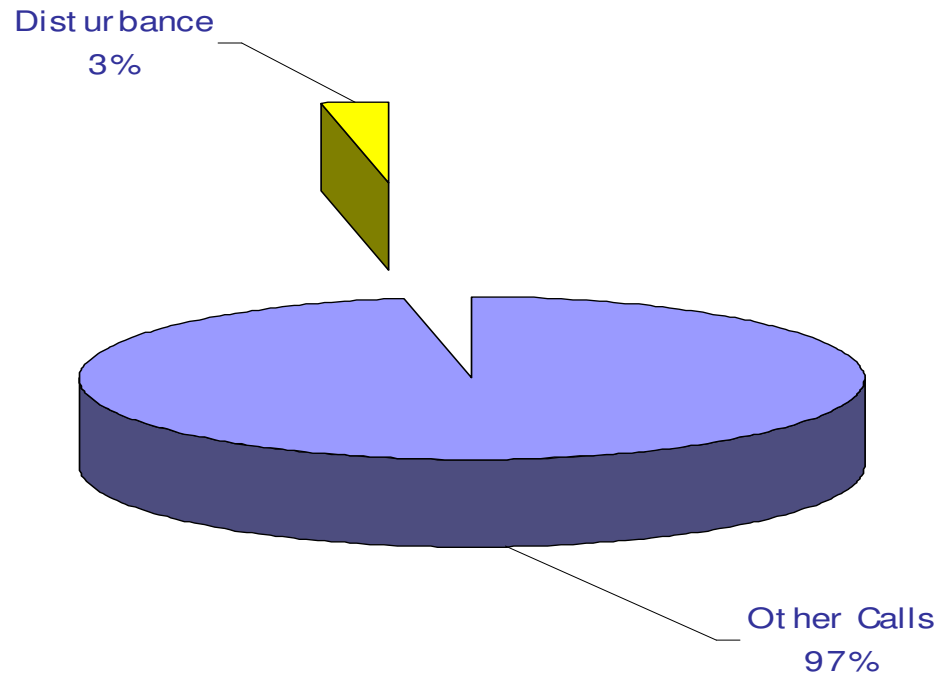
Assist Outside Agency



Assist Outside Agency: Fripp Island Security is called upon on many times to assist such outside agencies as Beaufort County Sheriff's Department, Fripp Island Sea and Rescue, Fripp Island Fire Department, various state, local and private agencies. Fripp Island Security assists with traffic control, crowd supervision, escorting EMS to a medical call or assistance with service of an arrest or search warrant.

Disturbance 2004

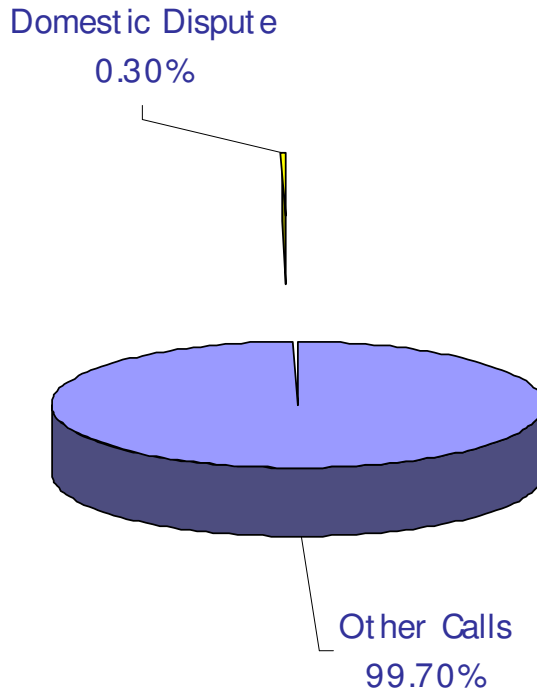

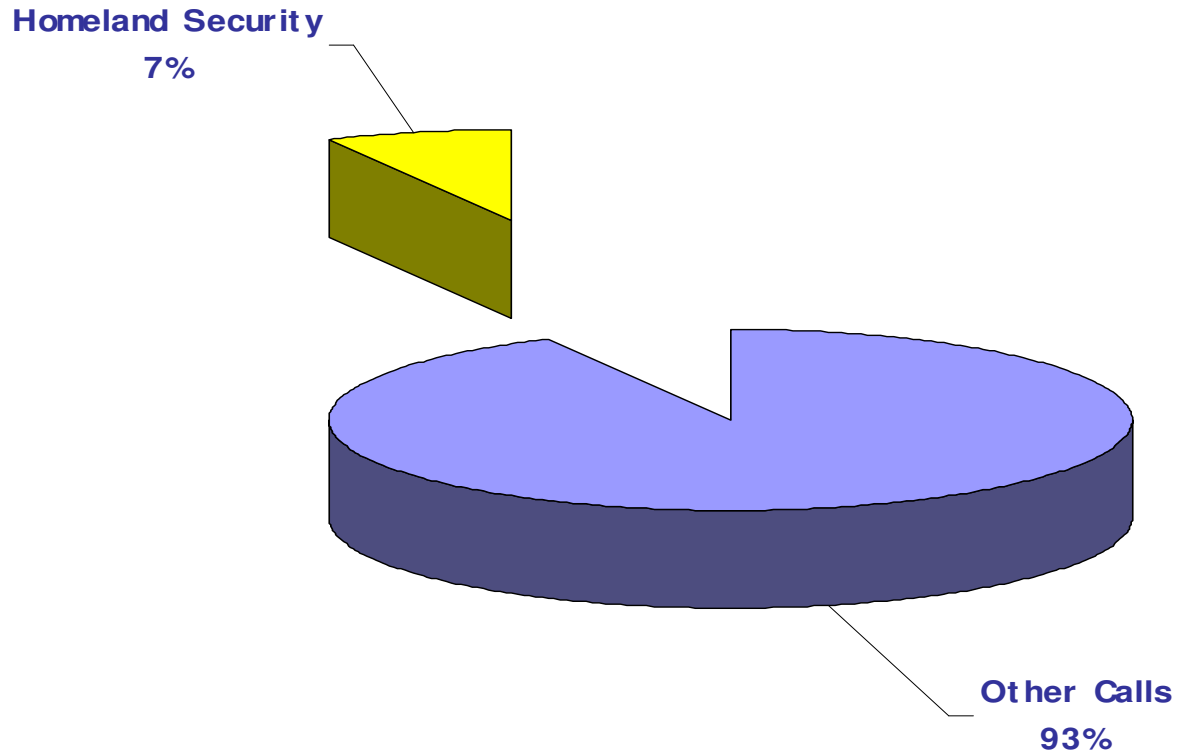
Domestic Dispute

Homeland Security 2004

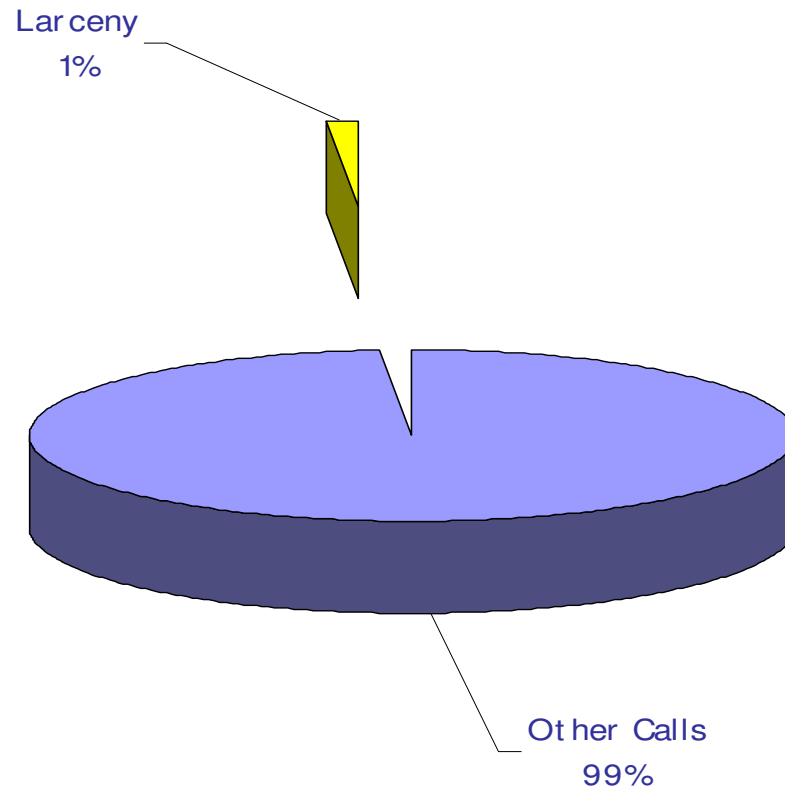


Homeland Security: In this post 911 era, it is important for individuals as well as small communities such as Fripp Island, to remain vigilant. As part of Fripp Island Security's duty, several sites on and off Fripp Island are checked at least once a day to insure that nothing has been vandalized or interfered with. These sites consist of the wastewater treatment plant, water towers and off island pumping stations.

Larceny 2004

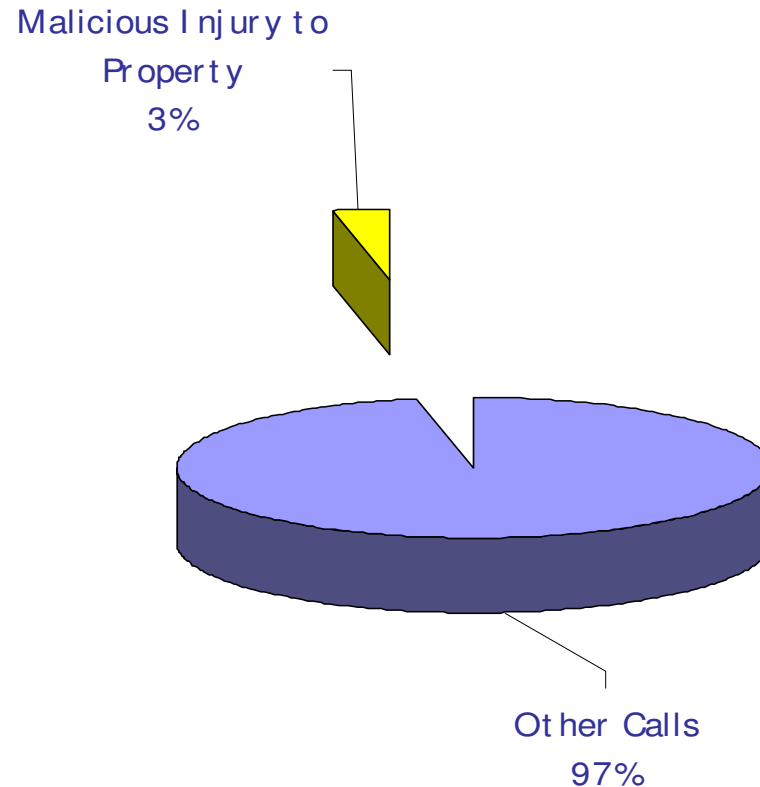


Larceny: Although there were 44 larceny calls for the year 2004, the majority of larceny calls involved missing golf carts that were later located, small tools, and miscellaneous items. There were no grand larcenies on Fripp Island this past year. More larcenies were reported for 2004 compared to 2003.

Malicious Injury to Property

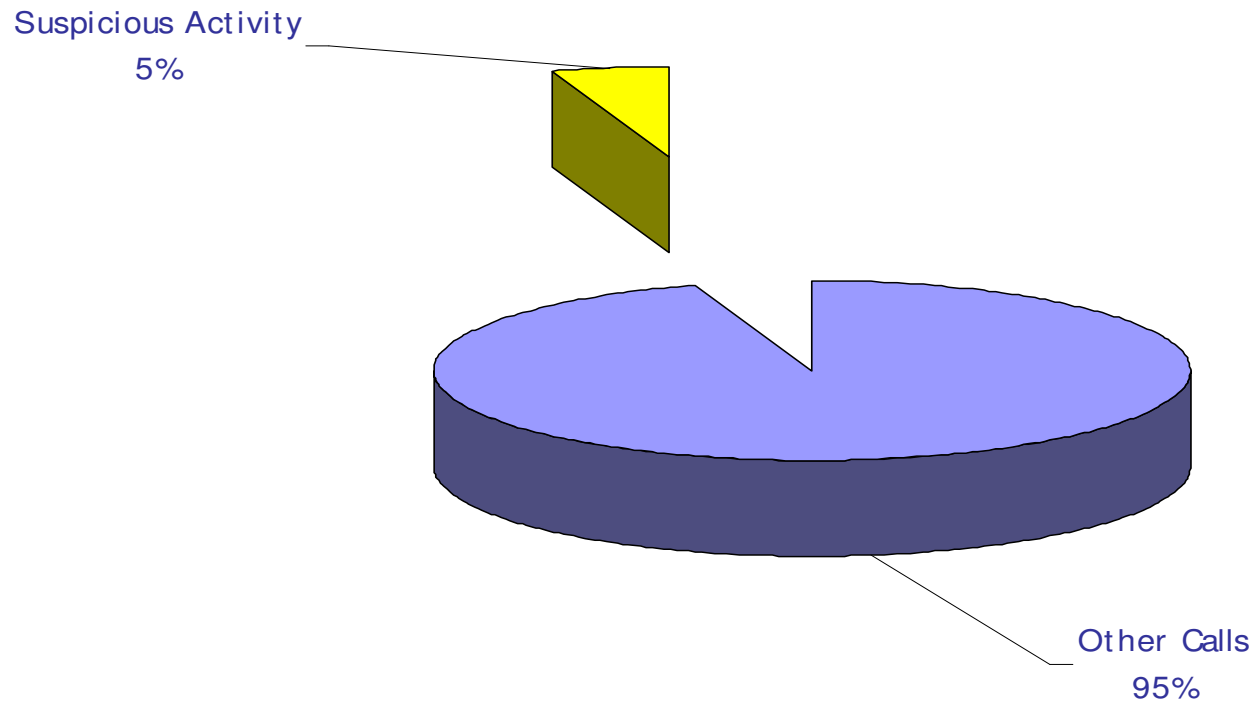


Malicious Injury to Property: The majority of our calls for 2004 consisted of damaged mailboxes. The incidents of malicious injury have dramatically decreased since last year.

Suspicious Activity



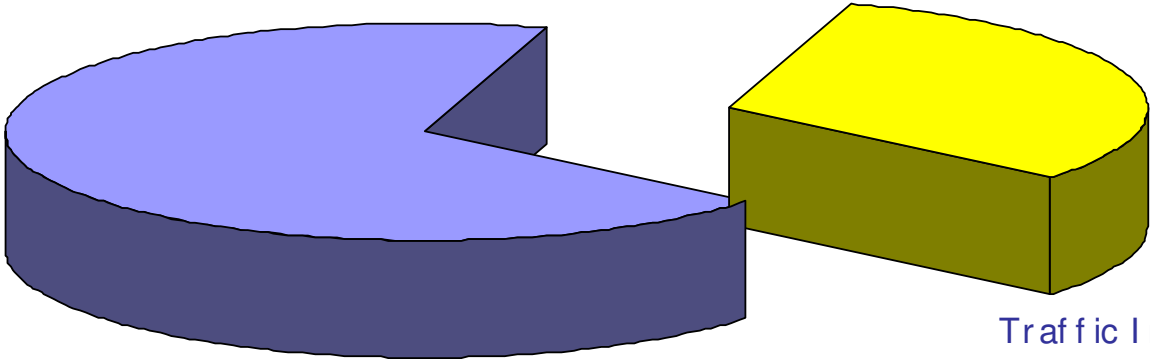
Suspicious Activity: Any suspicious activity called in by a resident or visitor, or found by a security officer is investigated. At times the calls are unfounded and still other calls require follow up such as checking ID's. Fripp Island Security officers can happen upon suspicious activity as it happens and follow through with an investigation.

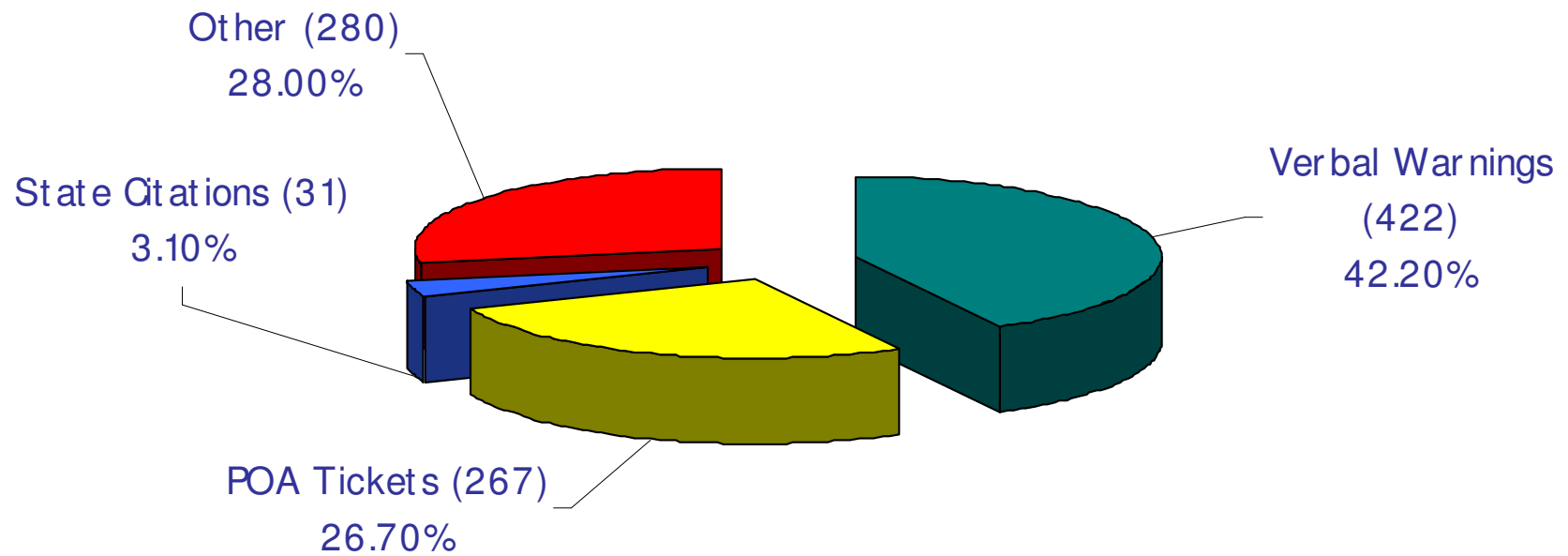

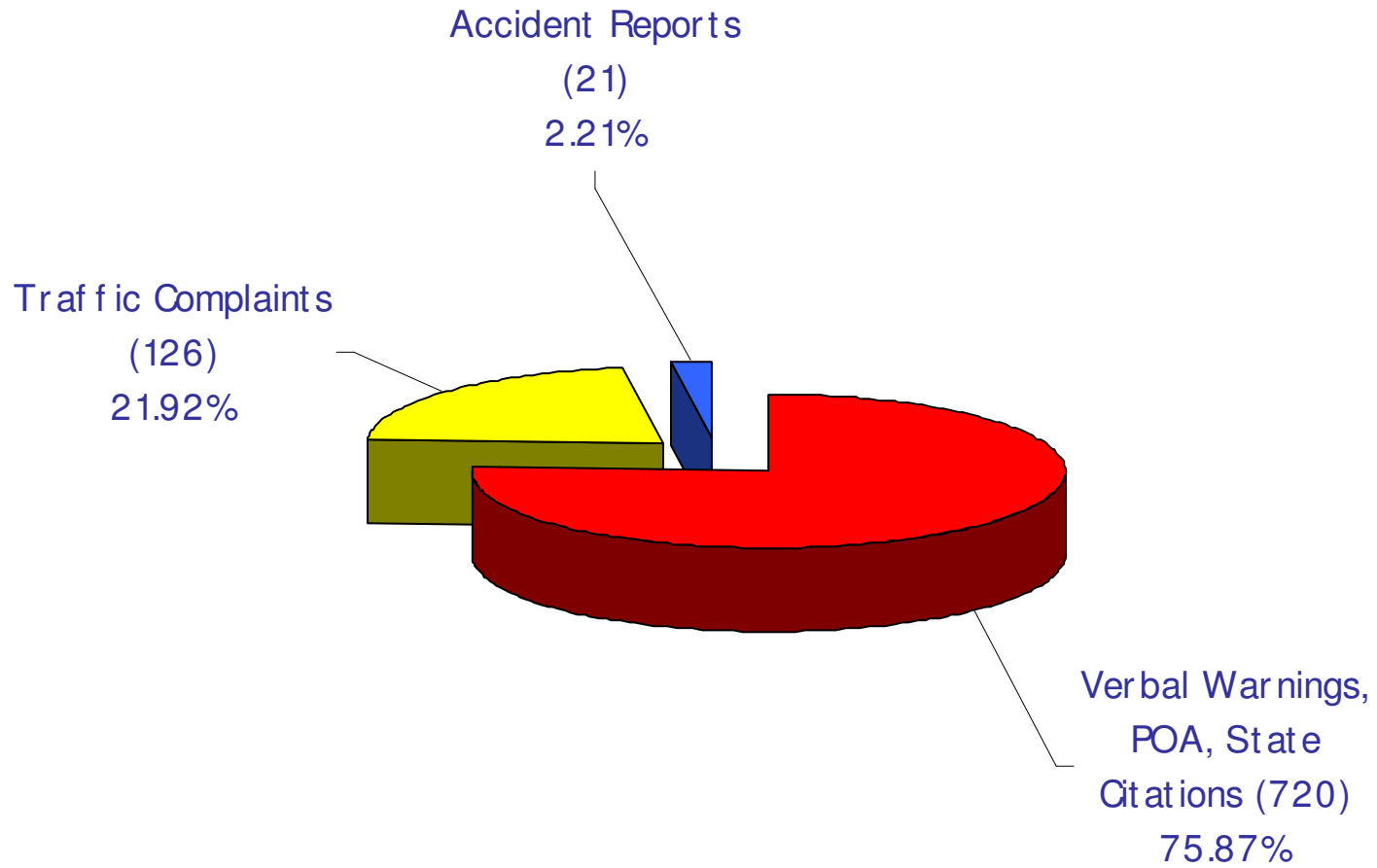

Breakdown of Traffic Incidents



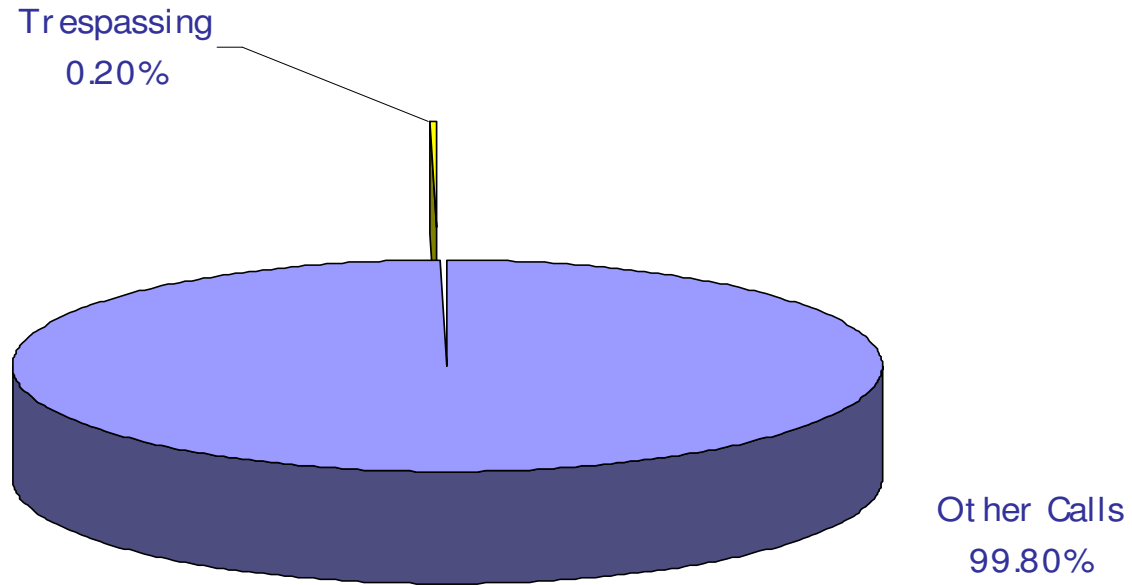
■ Verbal Warnings (422) ■ POA Tickets (267) ■ State Citations (31) ■ Other (280)

Trespassing

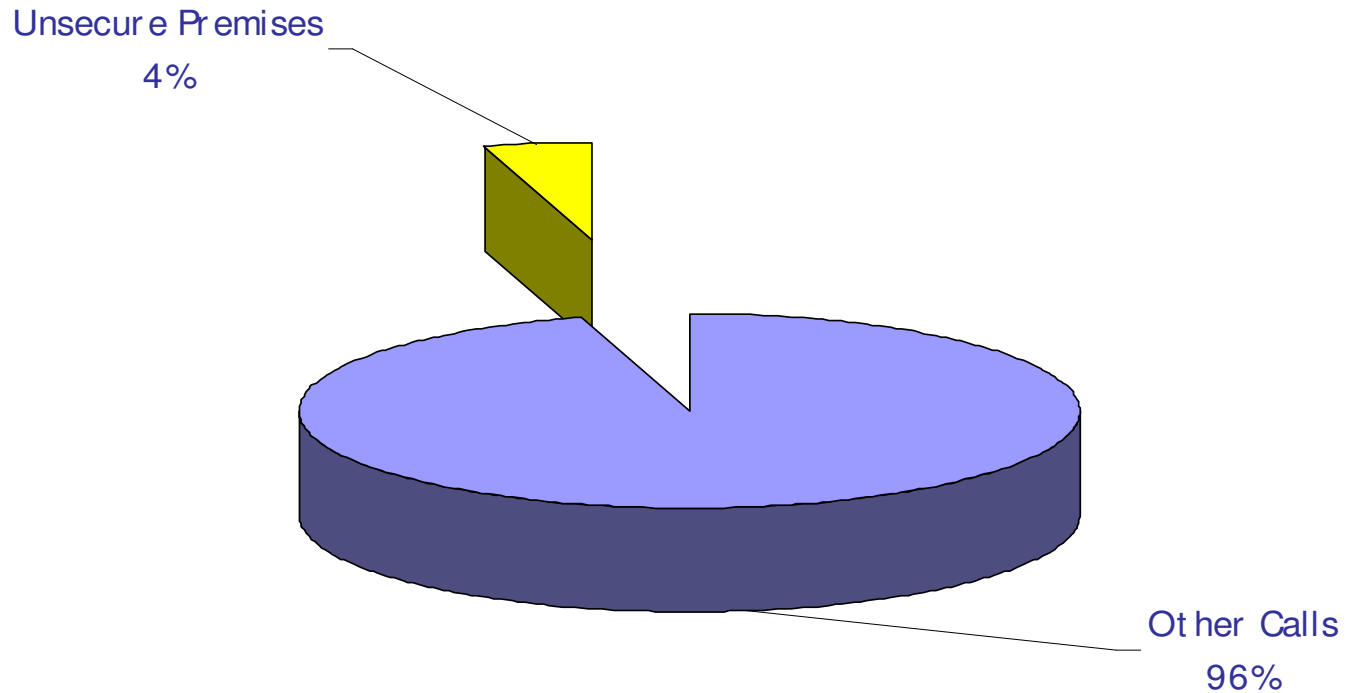

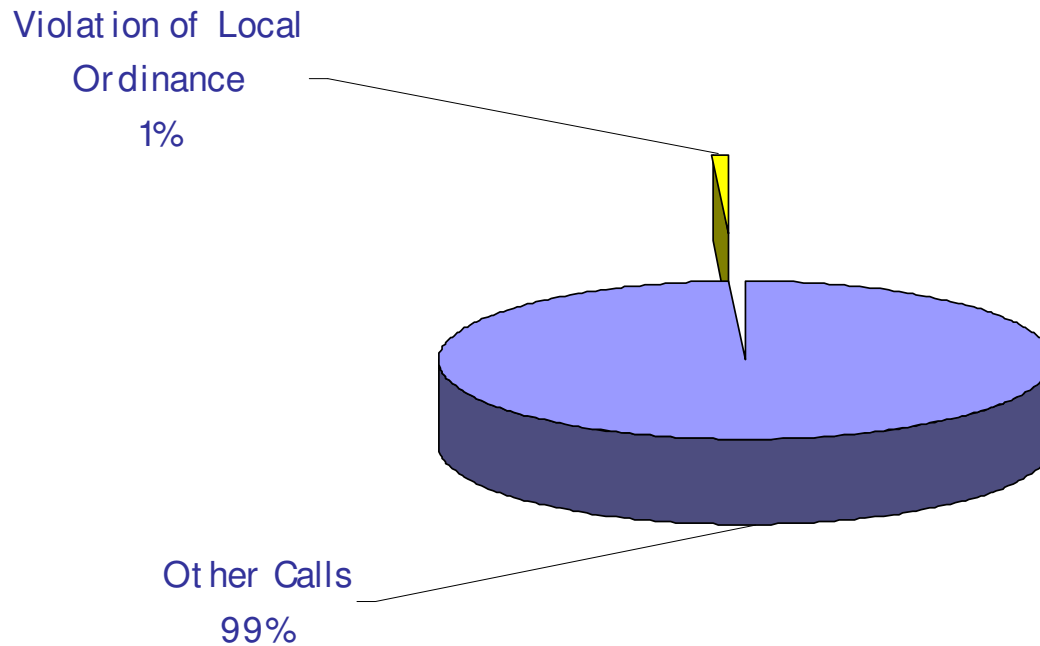
Unsecure Premises
